
Souvenir of Midgley and Luddenden War Memorial





HE original of this Cross known as "St. Martin's Cross" is situated in the grounds of Iona

Cathedral in the Inner Hebrides, Scotland—and the Cathedral is on the foundation of a Monastery founded in 563 by Columba and his twelve disciples from Ireland. The Abbey was built in the 12th century, and is the burial ground containing tombs of Scottish Kings, four Irish Kings and eight Norwegian.

"St. Martin"—the soldier saint and bishop—"Armistice Day" on "St. Martin's Day." November 11th.

The Hebrews were forbidden to make images and therefore did not care to produce ideal forms with a view to their suitableness for delineation. Each feature had its meaning, as eyes for knowledge, horns and lion's body for strength, eagle wings for swiftness, but it was never intended to form a whole resembling any actual creature, or with any attempt at symmetry of form.

Beasts or monsters symbolic of World Power arranged openly against Christ, and Worldly Wisdom setting Worldly Power in motion.

The four-footed creatures placed erect are thus incapable of exerting strength which they once manifested.

Pair of turtle doves. The Blessed Virgin's offering at "The Presentation of Christ in the Temple," the one for sin offering, the other for burnt offering.


Redemption of First-born—a living oblation.

Serpents. "That old Serpent the Devil." Almost throughout the East the Serpent was used as an emblem of the evil principle—the hosts of evil—sin in all its forms.

"The seed of the woman it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel."

The enmity and conflict was to be between serpent and his seed on the one side, and the woman and her seed on the other.

The Blessed Virgin Mary "the highly favoured" mother who took away the reproach of Eve, and whose seed, Jesus Christ, overcame the serpent.
