WW1 COMMEMORATIONS

Three commemorations of the deaths of local soldiers who



died at the Battle of Arras, and who are named on the local War Memorial, took place during the last month. These were of

Privates Matthew Ackroyd, Tom Summerscales and Herbert Murgatroyd. In each case, information about the men was read out, a ceramic cross was planted, and the Church bell was tolled once for every year of their life.

The next commemoration, will be that of Willie Mitchell, on Tuesday, 25th April at 12 noon at the War Memorial opposite the Lord Nelson. From Bank Bottom, he was 29 years of age and has no known grave, but like the above three is commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais, France



On Wednesday 3rd May, this will be followed by a commemoration ceremo-High Street Court in the centre of Lud-

ny at 12 noon for John Murgatroyd who lived at 57 High Street Court in the centre of Luddenden. Thanks to Calderdale Community Foundation for their financial support of the project.
