PLANNING APPLICATIONS

No new planning applications have been submitted to Calderdale since the last newsletter. The following two have both received planning permission: a two storey side extension to 7 Carr Field Drive and Demolition of a rear lean to porch to facilitate a two storey extension at 23 High Street.

We have also an apology to make regarding the regulations for felling trees in a conservation area which we included in the last newsletter. These have now been revised, and the latest revision is as follows: the local planning authority must be given six weeks notice before carrying out work on trees in a conservation area which are not protected. Notice need not be given if the tree is less than 7.5cm in diameter measured 1.5 metres above the ground, or 10cm if thinning to help the growth of other trees. Thanks to Philip Cawkwell who pointed out the error.

DVDs OF BAHT (WITHOUT) MEAT WEEK, AND THE FLOOD AND FIRE

Following on from the success of the Bah't Meat Week DVD, we've now created a DVD of material about the Oats Royd mill fire and major floods in 1989.
