LAST MEETING

At the last meeting Mr. Rob. Hamilton from the Halifax Great War Society gave a talk on 'The Amazing Mrs. Humphries'. This lady lived in Luddenden, and in the early 1900s, moved abroad and ended up in America. There, she and her husband made a wager that they would travel all around the world in two years, using normal transport. They originally paid their way by giving talks in various cities they came to, and selling photographs. She covered most of the Americas and Australia, but never got to Africa or the Asian continents. Money was always short, and there came many requests to father back in Luddenden for more. The attempt was finally ended on the outbreak of war in 1914, when she came back to England, settled down and finally died in the early 1960s.
