LAST MEETING

A film of The Battle of the Somme was shown at the last meeting, as part of our World war 1 project, a grant for which was made by the Calderdale Community Foundation. The film was shot during the battle, and certainly showed all the horrors of war. We all found it extremely moving. A lively discussion was also held on the decision of the Society's Planning Committee not to either back or object to the plan for a house in front of the old Methodist Chapel, but remain neutral. We would, however, point out that the Society publicises all planning applications for the village, thereby enabling everyone to comment upon an application should they wish.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

There have been two planning applications submitted to Calderdale since the last meeting. The first, number 16/00960/HSE is for a new external access stairway to the side of 9 East View, New Road. The second, number 16/00927/HSE is to replace the existing conservatory with new balcony over, open porch to front and extension to existing car port to pitched roof and new parking area at Gate Cottage, Halifax Lane (top of Ive House Lane). Any comments about these should be made to Town Planning Department, Northgate House, Halifax HX1 1UN.

The plan mentioned above for a house in front of the old Methodist Chapel has been turned down by Calderdale. A previous plan to that for Mill House Barn has been withdrawn for a new plan to be submitted with time for comments regarding the new application.

WORLD WAR 1 COMMEMORATIONS

The commemoration of the death of Edwin Ackroyd will take place at the War Memorial on 15th September.. These are taking place for all the people who are named on the memorial, and as in the past, the circumstances of each man's death is read out, and the church bell tolled once for every year of their life. Edwin Ackroyd lived in Luddenden at Halifax Lane, and was aged 30. Before his death, he worked at Watson's Mill, Sowerby Bridge. The family did in fact suffer a double tragedy, as a brother to Edwin was also later killed in action.
